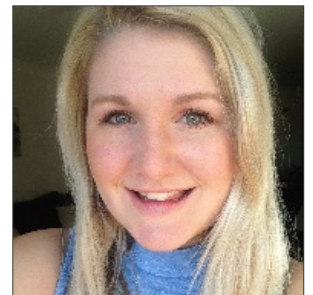


## Moira Smith, OMF, East Asia

## Rebekah McGregor, School Pastors, Aberdeen

Please pray for School Pastors and the team at St Machar school as they restart for the new year, that God will use the team to support and love the young people. Pray for opportunities to speak God's truth and love into their lives. Pray for Rebekah's counselling studies, especially for her counselling placements. Rebekah hopes to do a trip with Justice Rising to DR Congo this year. Pray for perfect timing and for a way to be made with visas. A huge answer to prayer is that the children's Kingdom Curriculum that Rebekah wrote is being run in a number of Justice Rising's schools. The trip will be focused on helping to develop the curriculum and continue the work of establishing it in the schools that have been built.

### Teen Challenge, Aberdeen

Teen Challenge helps men and women in NE Scotland find freedom from addiction. They ask for prayer for the residents of their 2 centres, Sunnybrae and Benaiah, to:

- Find strength and determination to come through the initial physical detox stage of recovery;
- Gain clear direction for their futures;
- Restore relationships with their families;
- Be active in sharing their personal stories of freedom with family and friends;
- Become firmly established in churches, as they move on from Sunnybrae and Benaiah;
- Find homes, and not simply houses, in supportive communities;
- Get connected within a healthy circle of family and friends.
